# Pear Friends,

The rains are finished; Malawi is in full 'harvest mode'. Trucks and carts are everywhere, full of maize. The dark greens are beginning to fade and cooler temperatures on the way.

The build up to the elections were peaceful and we are proud of how they were held. There were serious tensions just months ago, but the previous President won with a large majority, in a peaceful election with people starting to vote on policies rather than old tribal strongholds.

Madonna has been in the news again! Again our comment is really 2 questions and we have no answer. Firstly 'who are we to judge?' and is it better to do something and no doubt make some mistakes along the way or do nothing?

Malawi is No2! Currently, according to the IMF, Malawi has the fastest growing economy in the world behind Qatar. Well done Malawi!

## **Building**

This is now on the last stretch, just a little plumbing and wiring to go - the final colours on the wall! We have been having team meetings in the building already and we are excited to move in fully. A few weeks ago DFID gave us some office furniture they no longer required. This was such a blessing as these types of goods are so expensive here and to be given them for free is refreshing.

Electricity and water are our next challenge, the electricity company will only connect us once the building is finished and inspected. We will need a new section of line about 250m long, so we hope they have poles and wires (often they don't!).

## **Leaders Training**

Our leaders have just had a harvest break and time off for the election. Bill kindly wrote a special session on elections for us which was a big hit. It was a surprise to most people that we could teach about following Jesus and our responsibility at elections without talking about politics!

George and Tom have been meeting to discuss and edit Bill's gift of Follow Me 2. As a team we have been talking about how to structure the next part of this journey. We will be in the new building by then and split the current group in to two, to allow for deeper discipleship. Below are some extracts from thank you letters to Bill from the group. It is wonderful to see people learning and growing.

'Dear Brother Bill, I thank you for the book you designed Follow Me, it has helped me in my spiritual life and even my family has changed. It was very difficult for me to forgive other people in the past but now I am a changed man.'

'Bill Dixon, I would like to say my thanks for the teaching which has revived me. Before even though I was going to Church I was still practicing and having belief in cultural practices like consulting a witch doctor, no matter how small a problem. But now because of this book titled Follow Me I'm now a strong person in my spiritual life. I'm now in the hands of God.

'The book called Follow Me has helped me a lot. Especially the chapter called The Leaders Call. In the beginning I did not know that a leader has to be called by God to be a leader, so now I am thanking you Bill Dixon very much, because I am changed in the Lord.

Chippo has finished his probation and we are so pleased that he has become a solid team member in such a short time frame. We have had wonderful news from Kevin and Erika who will be coming from South Africa in September to run the second part of the complete training course. They have also put us in contact with the nearest running project; this is in Lusaka, Zambia! We hope to send Chippo to see the work there and come back envisioned and with tips!

Our research for community and church CHE continues to go well and the CHE structure is very challenging and thorough. It is by far the best grass roots material we have seen in the seven years we have been here. All of this would not be possible without Nick and Fiona from Birmingham who are partnering with us on this vision for holistic health.

#### **UK Visit**

We are back for a fleeting visit before returning to Malawi to host UK visitors. Now the boys are in school our window for staying in the UK is very small as we still need to provide access to the work of the Trust. The

Dalitso Trust family is resourced mainly by individuals who have come to know us personally, share in the vision and believe in changing Malawi. We are supported by hands, hearts and minds rather than by grants or big business and feel called to develop a relational style of work/partnership. We are passionate about educating leaders and young people, serving the poor, connecting people with God and seeing Malingunde transformed from within. Being back in the UK is allowing us to appreciate and see the effects of the credit crunch. We want to thank you for your continued personal support and commitment.
