Pear Friends,

Bingu was overwhelmingly re-elected as President and has just had the first 100 days of his 2nd term. Malawi was rightly proud of peaceful, well run elections. In June we had a typical whirlwind trip to the UK, squeezing time between Malawi school holidays; followed by hosting visitors here in the UK's school holidays!

Building? YES but not officially!



We were handed the keys in late July and we have been busy making this structure home. The furniture from DFID has been trucked out from Lilongwe and put

together and some increased security. Many thanks to Nigel Morris for all his help. Electricity is on the way we hope, we have had to pay a staggering £733 to be connected. Water is our next challenge, we are waiting for a reply on an application to use water from the Dam. If unsuccessful, we will need to raise about £4k for a borehole, giving us clean drinking water (which the Dam does not have). Once we have these services we can then officially open!

Youth Work

Local churches are helping oversee these groups and we are taking a step back. This has happened a lot quicker than we had planned, but due to financial constraints we are trying to be proactive in stewarding our resources wisely. This is the first time we have shut a programme due to lack of funding. Symon is still overseeing these groups and we will continue to train and encourage the leaders when funds allow.

Community Health Evangelism

CHE now represents over 50% of our work and Chippo is such an asset. He is now going to be writing this section, so welcome Chippo!

HI, my name is Chippo Chale. My family and I moved to Malingunde in late January. It has been hard to settle in as a family, due to moving from a town to a village.



We are now comfortable and expect our third child in December! I feel most welcome in the Dalitso family and had a lot of help from the other staff. In terms of CHE we are working in Mbanga community, three families and Ndumira Church.

We are finishing our research and awareness meetings. This means that Kevin and Erica from Lifewind in South Africa are travelling up to run our next CHE training course from the 14th to 18th September. We are too much excited as this will equip us for the next step; committee formation, training them and then the training of local health visitors. So it's a challenging, exciting time!

I have just come from Zambia where the nearest CHE project is. I went to learn from Lovemore who has been doing CHE for more than 10 years in Lusaka. We are just starting, so it is good to learn from someone who has been doing it for sometime. Nick and Fiona visited in August with their 3 girls to see CHE first hand together, a great encouragement to us.

Crunch

As we are starting to feel the effects of the crunch with financial support decreasing, we have finished our youth programmes early and plan to sell one of our older motorbikes.

As you are probably aware, The Dalitso Trust family is resourced mainly by individuals who have come to know us personally, share in the vision and believe in changing Malawi through relationships.

The bigger picture beyond local families is to be a beacon and a centre of excellence to encourage and inspire the local communities around us to develop their own play centres. We are currently looking for funding for this project, so if you can help please contact us.
