In some parts there has been no rain so far this rainy season so there is some anxiety as to when and how much rain there will be for the crops to grow.

Rhodess (below) has made wonderful progress with Dalitso Play and the whole team is doing well with Chippo continuing to lead with integrity, wisdom and increasing confidence. This has been a special blessing, as Tom has been and continues to be very ill; more of that later.

Healthy Families Creating Healthy Villages

Community CHE - Chippo

Mbanga had cultural challenges due to how much authority the Chief has over everything in the village. CHE is a question led learning process which leads to people questioning and assessing their lives and community.

The result often leads to many challenging questions for those in power/authority as the village learns to ask good questions about why certain things are done. A favourite has been 'why are our children not allowed to go to school?' due to the Chiefs wishes.

We are so pleased that the village has resolved their differences peacefully and now they have started working together towards their community holistic development and willingly they have plans to raise chickens for food, commercial and droppings for fertilizer. Mbanga challenge was a lesson to us a training team.

"I do not want to stop attending CHE because what I learn helps me, my family and the whole community. I am learning how to forgive, love and helping those who are in need. My children are now attending school with the courage of CHE, before I feared to talk to my husband about sending our children to school because my husband likes our traditional culture too much" **Precious**

In Chanika village where Cecil is working with the CHEs, the second is Ndumira village where Janet and Patterson have been working together and the main focus is for them to build good relationship with CHEs because they are new. We are pleased that we are starting CHE lessons together as a community.

In Chakwindima village where Jonathan and I go together the work is going very well as the village has not had many relief organisations working there. Due to this people desire to take responsibility for their needs. We follow the community's choice in learning topics and their need has been lessons about many common sicknesses they suffer from, but do not understand.

We have taught on malaria, back pain, headache, diarrhoea etc. We are now moving to farming and looking at compost manure and raising chickens.

"I did not go to school and I do not know how to read and write. I thought am nothing because the world needs educated people, but I want to surprise you that I am a teacher through CHE. I am now teaching others health lessons, fertilizer making and am leading Bible study in my community. What a joy I have, CHE has empowered me and my community." Timothy

Our new course Follow Me 5 has started, thank you again to Bill Dixon for your hard work in writing yet another course specifically for us. So we now have 5 courses running with Symon and Medson helping the team to deliver the courses.

'After starting Follow Me 1 I love it too much, So for that reason I decided to start my own group at the church I lead and have 13 participants attending. Chippo has visited our group which was a great encouragement' Green

As some of you may be aware, Tom has been seriously ill since the end of October with extreme fatigue and a whole variety of symptoms. After numerous blood tests he was admitted to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital here in Birmingham and whilst we are still awaiting the final diagnosis it is believed that he is suffering from amoebic dysentery, with complications as it has caused abscesses on his liver.

Whilst he is now home after a 10 day stay in hospital, he will be on strong medication for 2 months with outpatient appointments. We are very thankful to be in the UK to be able to access great healthcare.

Despite this challenging time the children have settled well into their school and are currently enjoying taking part in all the Christmas activities which were not part of school life in Malawi.

We are enjoying being part Vineyard Network Church Birmingham and have been made to feel very welcome.

Prior to his illness, Tom was continuing to manage the team in Malingunde whilst managing and developing the various elements that are crucial to the work here.

Ali's priority has been to settle the children into their new and somewhat alien surroundings.
